The image is of cement silos at Geelong, Victoria, painted and photographed by Tyrone Wright (born 1980), known commercially as *Rone*, a Victorian resident and internationally renowned street artist working out of *Everfresh* studios in Collingwood, Melbourne.

The artist's description of the artwork pictured:

(Left) Corrina Eccles is a direct descendant of Queen Mary of the Wadawurrung of central Victoria.

(Centre) Cor Horsten worked at this site for over 35 years. Cor now volunteers his time at a local retirement home and hand makes wooden toys that are gifted to children about to go into surgery.

(Right) Kelly Cartwright grew up in Portarlington, just outside Geelong. At 15, due to an aggressive cancer, she had her right leg removed. Despite this, she has since won Gold & Silver Medals at the Paralympics in Long Jump & 100 Metre Sprint.
