They represent our farmers, our professionals, our armed and emergency services, our entrepreneurs, our trades, the sports, creative industries and our social enterprises.

They represent a multitude of community groups, that work or volunteer with great dedication to offer land care, to help settle new arrivals or to extend a helping hand to those who might be doing it tough.

And they represent just the tip of an iceberg of talent upon which we shall rely as our State grows. Victoria, as well as the wider global community, needs their commitment and wisdom to meet the challenges of keeping our planet clean and safe, clever and harmonious.
