Governor of Victoria



Professor the Honourable Margaret Gardner AC was sworn in as Victoria's 30th Governor in August 2023.

The Governor undertakes a program that fulfils her four areas of responsibility:

1. Constitutional Responsibilities

The Governor oversees the workings of the government of the day to ensure it acts within the boundaries of the Victorian Constitution and the rule of law.

The Governor's main constitutional responsibilities in relation to the Government are to:

- · call an election
- chair the Executive Council
- give Royal Assent to Bills passed by both Houses of Parliament
- dissolve the Legislative Assembly in exceptional circumstances
- · appoint and dismiss Ministers.

2. Community Engagement

The Governor seeks to represent and understand the whole Victorian community and encourages unity, mutual respect and confidence among its members. The Governor is patron of many not-for-profit organisations and encourages people in a range of fields including voluntary service, innovation, education, artistic endeavours and sporting achievement.

3. Ceremonial Duties

The Governor's ceremonial duties include the Opening of Parliament; attending the Dawn Service and march past on ANZAC Day; swearing in Ministers and Supreme Court judges; presiding at investitures for the Order of Australia and other awards; and fulfilling the ceremonial role of 'University Visitor' of each Victorian university.

4. International Engagement

The Governor promotes Victoria's international economic, social and cultural interests, both at home and abroad.
